YOUR 15 EDITING STEPS

Cheat Sheet

- 1. CHOOSE YOUR SOFTWARE All have similar editing features; grab ones with free trials if you want to start learning the basics.
- 2. GATHER YOUR GOODIES Transfer + organize all the files you'll need into ONE place; store it on an external hard drive + make a copy of your hard drive.
- **3. IMPORT TIME** Import ALL the files you'll need into your editing program.
- **4. GET THE GOLD** Gather together your best takes/moments.
- **5. BUILDING THE FOUNDATION** Go section by section and insert the "gold" clips one at a time to create a rough draft of your video.
- **6. TRIM + CLEAN UP** trim the head and tail of your clips and delete the spaces.
- **7. TRANSITIONS**, **BABY!** Use the KISS rule (keep it simple superstar).
- **8. MUSIC TIME** use music to enhance the impact of your videos; use Royalty Free music (see Sarah's Recommended Resources); get free previews of the music you like; music shouldn't be too loud.
- 9. ROCK 'N' B-ROLL B-Roll is meant to help enhance your videos and your audience's learning by adding visual cues; can hide mistakes, awkward cuts and cover your voice-over sections.
- **10. WATCH IT, HEAR IT, SEE IT** When you're finished with the music and the B-Roll, watch the whole video again without stopping; use your different senses; take notes and make changes.
- **11. FEEDBACK** Export your video and send it to trusted peers and/or post it in our group and ask for feedback.
- **12. CHANGES BASED ON THE FEEDBACK** Decide what advice to take, and make the necessary changes; watch it once more then export it in a format compatible with the web.
- **13. ONE LAST DANCE** Watch the exported version one last time you may have missed something that becomes clear in the export; if you find any hiccups, make those changes, export it and watch the exported video once more.
- 14. UPLOAD to Vimeo, Youtube, etc.
- 15. SHARE + CELEBRATE.
